Junior School Uniform Policy

Early Learning Centre and Junior School Uniform Policy Overview

At St Paul's there are certain expectations for all students regarding the wearing of the school uniform. It should be clean, in good repair and worn correctly at all times. This helps the School to set and maintain high standards of appearance. It also instils a sense of pride in each student and promotes unity within the School. We ask for your cooperation in ensuring our uniform requirements are met.

Implementation

- The Dress Code applies during school hours, while travelling to and from school, and when students are on school excursions.
- Summer and winter uniforms will be prescribed, and are required to be worn.

Uniform Specifics

Additional items:

- School bags must be of the approved design with the St Paul's logo.
- Rain coats and rain hats, if worn, must be clear or dark blue.
- Gloves, if worn, must be plain dark blue or burgundy.
- Scarves may be dark blue, burgundy or white.
- Gloves and scarves should not be worn in class or at assemblies.
- School beanie (optional in winter).
- If a belt is worn with shorts or trousers it must be black leather only.
- An art smock is required and must be nylon coveralls.
- A library bag is required in which to borrow and return books.

Hairstyle and Grooming

- Hair must be tied back if it is below shoulder length and must be held with a plain dark blue, white or burgundy ribbon, or a plain band in one of these colours. It is inappropriate for any student to have a colour other than a natural hair colour.
- Students may not have hair styles which are extremes in length, colour or style.

Headwear

- The only headwear that is acceptable are the school hats or beanie (in Winter). The school hat is to be worn outside during Terms 1 and 4 and during times of the year of high UV radiation. Hats are not to be worn inside. School hats can be broad brimmed or bucket.

Jewellery and Makeup

- No visible jewellery may be worn except for wristwatches. Students may wear one small, plain sleeper or stud in the lobe of each ear. A small, discreet plain crucifix pendant on a thin chain necklace is accepted, but this must hang lower than the collar opening of the dress or shirt.
- Other than clear nail polish, cosmetics may not be worn at school.

Students Riding Bicycles and Scooters to School

- For safety reasons students who ride to school must wear an approved safety helmet. Safe and suitable casual clothing, instead of school uniform, may be worn for comfort. If so, students must arrive at school early and be changed into correct school uniform no later than 8:45 am.

Lost Property

Please make sure that all items of clothing are clearly named. Lost items that are named will be returned through the Junior School office and unnamed items will be held in the office awaiting collection.

School Shoe Requirements

The style of shoe and the types acceptable as meeting with the school Uniform Policy “..only black leather school shoes may be worn. Boots, suede shoes, ballet slippers, court shoes etc are not acceptable.”

Junior School Uniform

Early Learning, Prep, Year 1 and Year 2 Uniform (all year)

- Regulation polo top
- Regulation rugby top
- Navy unisex shorts with St Paul's emblem
- Navy tracksuit pants with St Paul's emblem
- Plain white (without logos) or navy sports socks (no anklets)
- Spray jacket
- Sports shoes
- School sun hat, broad brimmed or bucket (compulsory in Terms 1 and 4)



Years 3 to 6 Sport/PE Uniform

All students

- School sports hat
- House polo shirt
- Regulation rugby top
- Spray jacket
- Navy unisex shorts with St Paul's emblem
- Navy tracksuit pants with St Paul's emblem
- Plain white (without logos) or navy sports socks (no anklets)
- Sports shoes



Junior School Uniform

Years 3 to 6 Formal/Winter Uniform

Option A (compulsory Terms 2 and 3)

- St Paul's regulation pinafore (Students in Years 5 and 6 have the option of wearing the pinafore as a skirt. The bib of the pinafore is removable).
- Regulation white shirt
- Plain burgundy ribbon tie
- Blue jumper with school crest
- St Paul's blazer
- Navy blue socks/tights
- Black leather school shoes

Option B (compulsory Terms 2 and 3)

- College grey long trousers or navy school shorts
- Regulation Junior School shirt
- St Paul's Junior School tie
- Blue jumper with school crest
- St Paul's blazer
- Grey marl socks
- Black leather school shoes

Years 3 to 6 Summer Uniform

Option A (compulsory Terms 1 and 4)

- St Paul's regulation cotton dress
- Blue jumper with school crest
- St Paul's blazer
- Short or long white socks
- Black leather school shoes
- School sun hat (broad brimmed or bucket)

Option B (compulsory Terms 1 and 4)

- Regulation school shorts (navy)
- Regulation Junior School shirt
- Blue jumper with school crest
- St Paul's blazer
- Short navy socks
- Black leather school shoes
- School sun hat (broad brimmed or bucket)



Secondary School Uniform Policy

Secondary School Uniform Policy Overview

Wearing a uniform reinforces in students a pride in their own appearance, instils recognition of themselves as an integral part of the school community and assists in developing pride in representing their school. Issues of equality, health and safety, and expense are also factors that contribute to the establishment of the school uniform.

Implementation

- The Dress Code applies during school hours, while travelling to and from school, and when students are on school excursions.
- Summer and winter uniforms will be prescribed and are required to be worn.
- Students in Year 7 and 8 are permitted to wear sport uniform, including their house polo shirt, on Thursday all day.
- Students in Year 7 to 12 are permitted to wear sports uniform on the day they have a practical PE class.

Uniform Specifics

Wearing of blazers

Blazers must be worn to and from school every day in Terms 2 and 3 and must be worn to all formal assemblies and chapel throughout the year and when on school excursions, unless a staff member gives permission to remove blazers.

In Terms 2 and 3, students are expected to wear the blazer at all times in public. This means that students must wear their blazers:

- walking down the street
- in shops
- boarding and alighting from buses or cars, at either end of the journey
- walking home

Under no circumstances may the jumper be worn as the outer garment in public. The spray jacket is not to be worn with the formal uniform at any time.

Uniform for formal occasions

The appropriate uniform for special functions, formal occasions and non-sporting interschool competitions will be the formal version of uniform Option A or Option B including blazer (refer to table on page 9).

Dress and skirt length

- Dress, short and skirt length is to be such that the bottom of the hem is in line with the top of the bony part of the knee.

Belts

- There is a regulation black leather belt to be worn with the school trousers. No other type of belt is permitted.

Gloves and Scarves

- Gloves and scarves, if worn, must be plain dark blue or burgundy.

Headwear

- The only headwear that is acceptable are the School hats. They must be worn outside in Terms 1 and 4. Hats are not to be worn inside.

Secondary School Uniform Policy Continued

Hairstyle and Grooming

- Students must tie their hair back with a plain dark blue, burgundy or white ribbon, or a plain band in one of these colours. Alternate hair accessories are not permitted.
- Students may not have hair styles which are extremes of fashion in terms of length, style or colour. Students hair must be above the collar at all times, or tied back neatly.
- Beards and moustaches are not permitted.

Jewellery and Makeup

- No visible jewellery may be worn except for wristwatches. Students may wear one small, plain (gold or silver) sleeper or stud in the lobe of each ear. A small, discreet plain crucifix pendant on a thin chain necklace is accepted, but this must hang lower than the collar opening of the dress or shirt.
- Other than clear nail polish, makeup and cosmetics may not be worn at school. This includes blush, lipstick, eyeliner, mascara, artificial eyelashes and fingernails.

Tattoos and Facial Piercing

- No tattoos should be visible in any school uniform unless they are cultural or tribal and cannot be covered.
- No facial or tongue piercing.

School Bags

- School bags must be of the approved design with the St Paul's logo.
- Sports bags can also be purchased from Dobsons uniform shop.

Wet Weather Protection

- Students can wear a plain blue raincoat for wet weather protection. The spray jacket is part of the sport uniform and cannot be worn with the formal uniform at any time.

Students Riding Bicycles to School

- For safety reasons students who ride to school must wear an approved safety helmet. Safe and suitable casual clothing, instead of school uniform, may be worn for comfort. If so, students must arrive at school early and be changed into correct school uniform no later than 8:45 am. They must not change out of uniform and leave school earlier than 3:10 pm.

School Shoe Requirements

The style of shoe and the types acceptable as meeting with the school Uniform Policy “..only black leather school shoes may be worn. Boots, suede shoes, ballet slippers, court shoes etc are not acceptable.”
