Student Wellbeing

At St Paul's, student wellness is the focus of each school day and the core purpose of our Mentor Groups. We aim to understand the 'whole' child to create a meaningful connection between our students and staff

Every student has access to support staff, including counsellors/psychologists and chaplaincy staff, who help students thrive as both learners and individuals. We understand that wellbeing is dynamic and our program changes to meet the unique needs of students.

Our comprehensive Pastoral Care Program includes a combination of Chapel, guest speakers, assemblies and house meetings designed to cultivate a sense of belonging. We pride ourselves on our students being known, valued and celebrated within our school community – believing every student should be recognised for their personal learning, creative pursuits and sporting achievements.

A weekly pastoral session provides students with the opportunity to think meaningfully about the world they live in. Our Mentor Teachers and Heads of Year explore a range of issues that are relevant to the physical, spiritual, emotional and intellectual wellbeing of our students, preparing students with real-world skills for the future.

Growing With Your House

We are known for creating a sense of family amongst our students and staff through our House, Mentor and Peer Support Programs.

Our school has six houses which form the foundation of interhouse activities, pastoral care and support. Each student is allocated to a house, with members of the same family placed together. Students are also placed in a Mentor Group and Mentor Teachers and Heads of Year monitor the daily needs of individuals in their care, working together to foster a happy and safe learning experience.

Our houses are: Chisholm, Franklin, Gilmore, Lalor, Monash and Paterson.

Trust Mapping

At St Paul's we believe that connected students are those that feel happy, safe and respected. Year 7 students conduct a short relationship mapping activity, providing staff with valuable information that assists them in teaching each child, both as an individual and as part of a classroom cohort. The mapping also provides information about students' social and emotional concerns, allowing for early intervention on potential issues.

Part of the foundation of our Pastoral Care Program is encouraging our students to identify a trusted adult or adults within our school community. Respectful relationships underpin everything we do and encouraging our students to recognise and identify them is crucial in our ability to support them

Building Connection

Our Peer Support Program partners Year 7 students with senior students who support their transition into secondary school. Peer Support Leaders provide advice and create meaningful connections with our Year 7 students to foster a sense of belonging in their new environment.

Commencing at Friendship Morning, Peer Support Leaders continue to engage with students throughout Term 1, at camp, and then on occasions throughout the year. Becoming a Peer Support Leader requires commitment and training, and they act as mentors, guides and occasional confidantes, working together to establish new friendships that will flourish over the coming years.

All Things Outdoor

Our camp and outdoor education program is designed to: develop skills in a range of outdoor pursuits; enhance relationships with others and the environment; and promote personal growth in self-awareness, self-confidence, teamwork and leadership through challenge and

Our Year 7 camp in early Term 1 is part of our secondary school transition program. The camp aims to foster positive relationships and welcome new students into the St Paul's community. Peer Support Leaders join the students as they experience a range of adventure activities.

The Year 8 program visits Phillip Island; utilising the sand and sea of this iconic location, we build upon the skills introduced in Year 7.

Students participate in surfing, canoeing, stand-up paddleboarding, and personal and group challenges continuing to further their own individual growth whilst forging closer connections with their peers.

The focus of our Year 9 adventure camp is personal wellbeing and discovery. We spend three days combining mindfulness activities with adventure sessions to push comfort levels and develop self-reflection techniques.

Our camp program continues in Year 10 and ties in perfectly with The Duke of Edinburgh's Award, the world's leading youth achievement award. It also acts as a pathway into studies of Sport and Recreation in Years 11 and 12.

How to PrepareSix Steps To Transition

Commencing secondary school is a time of anticipation and change. Whether you are transitioning from a large or small primary school, or are already at St Paul's, our priority is to ensure you feel comfortable in your new learning environment as soon as possible.

1. Information Evening

You and your parents begin to hear about and experience firsthand the array of educational and co-curricular opportunities on offer at secondary school at St Paul's. You can take a tour, hear from our staff and gain an understanding of what learning at St Paul's will be like.

2. Welcome Interview

For families new to St Paul's, you will be invited to attend a personal interview where we get to know your family and discover your unique interests, aptitudes and abilities. We will also take the time to answer any questions you may have.

Existing St Paul's students will spend time getting to know our Secondary School Leadership Team through Junior School activities.

3. Friendship Morning

Friendship Morning is a fantastic opportunity for you to familiarise yourself with our teaching staff and pastoral leaders, find your way around the campus and meet your

new classmates. The Peer Support Program commences and you will enjoy a fun-filled morning of activities and games.

4. Orientation Days

An extended three-day orientation provides you with more time to interact with your new friends and have lessons with many of our teachers. You will find out about our laptop program and participate in a music session. School Prefects, House Captains and Peer Support Leaders will be on hand to help you settle in.

5. Welcome Twilight Evening

Families gather at an informal barbeque which provides students the opportunity to organise their lockers and meet their mentors before the first day of school.

6. Peer Support Camp

Designed to foster and develop new friendships, you will experience a range of adventure and problemsolving activities with an emphasis on personal responsibility, independence and collaboration. All about learning

Classroom Learning Core Subjects

Each day is divided into six lessons, with breaks for recess and lunch.
All students study subjects in the following core areas of learning:

- · Christian Studies
- English
- · Health and Physical Education
- Humanities
- Language (Japanese)

- Arts/Technology
- Sport

Students study Japanese and may choose to continue studying this through to the VCE level. An alternative language subject can be undertaken at extra cost through the Victorian School of Languages and is studied as an additional subject. Please read our Course Guide for further information.

The Arts/Technology program is an exciting part of the curriculum. Every student will have the opportunity to be involved in each of the Arts/Technology strands through a rotation of subjects. The subjects are delivered through the faculties of Visual Arts, Performing Arts, Science/IT and Health.

Academic TransitionIndividualised Education

Effective transition ensures every child can feel safe, known and acknowledged as they begin to navigate the requirements of learning at secondary school.

Upon commencement, testing in Mathematics and English, alongside NAPLAN data and previous school reports, helps guide student placement in classes, allocate support resources and promote enrichment opportunities.

Learning With LaptopsLaptop Program

Modern learning requires students to be familiar with computing technology and the ability to research and complete work using digital methods. Students will use laptops regularly for learning and will be required to bring these to school every day.

Students will be provided with training regarding the safe use of the laptop and learn how to access resources on the school network. Instruction and guidance regarding the use of key programs will be implemented as part of the academic program.

Your Choice Of Adventure

Our elective offering allows our students to develop a passion for subjects they love to learn. These classes are tailored, fun and engaging and present a learning pathway all the way through to VCE. What will your learning passion be?

The Years 7 and 8 'Choose Your Own Adventure' Elective Program provides students with the opportunity to participate in a two-year program across Years 7 and 8.

High Performance Program

Elite Sports Performers (ESP) Program
The ESP Program caters to a growing
number of secondary students at
St Paul's who are competing in their
chosen sport at a junior elite level
and require additional support and
flexibility of curriculum to manage their
studies concurrently with training and

competition commitments.

The program has two main components: the support of the student athlete and the development of the student athlete. Students also benefit regularly from elite athlete guest speakers and presentations by industry leaders in athlete development. Program students are supported by the iNSPIRE app which is designed for young athletes to monitor their wellness and assist in their holistic development.

Participants also attend a biennial Elite Athlete Camp at the Australian Institute of Sport.

Athlete Development Program (ADP)

The ADP nurtures student athletes who are highly committed to their sport at a community level and are focused on progressing in their chosen sport.

The ADP caters for students who may be at a high local level in their sport but are yet to experience the training, travel and competition commitments of the highest level.

ADP students receive access to the Athlete Development App and guest speakers to motivate them and teach them how to monitor their wellbeing while becoming a better athlete (as do ESP students).

Academy of Music

The first of its kind in a Gippsland school and a rare opportunity for orchestral, choral and keyboard students, the Academy of Music offers students access to specialist ensemble training and performance along with musical mentoring opportunities.

Open to students by audition, the Academy offers a dedicated focus through timetabled classes for the development of students' chamber and orchestral skills. With professionally delivered workshops in addition to combined, cross-campus orchestral and choral rehearsals, students have many opportunities to perform at a range of venues.

Incorporating live concert exposure and collaboration with professional conductors, educators and performers alike, the Academy inspires students to take their musical studies and ensemble skills to the next level.
